There will be shade, but we recommend hats, sunglasses, sunscreen and bringing your own water bottle. The seats are hard plastic, so you may want to bring a cushion and whatever you need to be comfortable for the day. VocalEye will supply headsets, beads, tattoos and some snacks. Water refills and an accessible washroom will be available on site.
